Community Attitude and Interest Survey

Executive Summary of Citizen Survey Results

Overview of the Methodology

Leisure Vision conducted a Community Attitude and Interest Survey for the Northern Virginia Regional Park Authority, Loudoun County, the City of Fairfax, and the City of Falls Church during May and June of 2007. The purpose of the survey was to establish priorities for the future improvement of parks and recreation facilities, programs and services within the region. The survey was designed to obtain statistically valid results from households throughout Loudoun County, the City of Fairfax, and the City of Falls Church. The survey was administered by a combination of mail and phone.

Leisure Vision worked extensively with Northern Virginia Regional Park Authority and Loudoun County, City of Fairfax, and City of Falls Church officials in the development of the survey questionnaire. This work allowed the survey to be tailored to issues of strategic importance to effectively plan the future system.

In May 2007, surveys were mailed to a random sample of 2,000 households in Loudoun County, 2,000 surveys in the City of Fairfax, and 500 surveys in the City of Falls Church. Approximately three days after the surveys were mailed, each household that received a survey also received an electronic voice message encouraging them to complete the survey. In addition, about two weeks after the surveys were mailed, Leisure Vision began contacting households by phone, either to encourage completion of the mailed survey or to administer the survey by phone.


The goal was to obtain a total of at least 900 completed surveys, with at least 400 coming from Loudoun County households, 400 from City of Fairfax households, and 100 from City of Falls Church households. These goals were accomplished, with a total of 1,000 surveys having been completed, including 434 from Loudoun County, 448 from the City of Fairfax, and 118 from the City of Falls Church. The results of the random sample of 1,000 households have a 95% level of confidence with a precision of at least +/-3.1%.

Participation in Recreation Programs or Park Sponsored Events

Respondents were asked if they or members of their household have participated in any recreation programs or park sponsored events during the past 12 months. The following summarizes key findings:


• Forty-six percent (46%) of respondent households have participated in recreation programs or park sponsered events during the past 12 months.



Where Respondent Learned About Park's Programs and Activities

Respondent households that have participated in recreation programs or park sponsored events during the past 12 months were asked to indicate where they learned about the programs and events. The following summarizes key findings:


• Of the 46% of respondent households that have participated in recreation programs or park events during the past 12 months, 42% have learned about the programs or events through flyers/brochures. The other most frequently mentioned ways that respondents learn about programs and events are through word of mouth (34%), the Authority's brocure (26%) and the newspaper (24%).



Quality of the Recreation Programs

Respondent households that have participated in recreation programs or park sponsored events during the past 12 months were asked to rate the quality of the recreation programs they have participated in. The following summarizes key findings:


Of the 46% of respondent households that have participated in recreation programs or park events during the past 12 months, 93% rated the programs as either excellent (44%) or good (49%). In addition, 5% rated the programs as fair, and less than 1% rated them as poor.



Visitation of Area Parks and Recreation Facilities

Respondents were asked if they or members of their household have visited any parks or recreation facilities in City/County of their residence during the past year. The following summarizes key findings:


- Seventy-one percent (71%) of respondent households have visited parks or recreation facilities in the City/County of their residence during the past year. 

Need for Parks and Recreation Facilities



Need For Parks and Recreation <u>Facilities</u> in Loudoun County, City of Fairfax and City of Falls Church



How Well Parks and Recreation Facilities Meet Needs



Loudoun County, City of Fairfax and City of Falls Church Households with Their <u>Facility</u> Needs Being <u>50% Met or Less</u>




Based on the sum of their top 4 choices, the facilities that respondent households rated as the most important include: paved walking and biking trails (38%), small community parks (27%), indoor pools for recreation swimming (22%) and indoor exercise and fitness facilities (19%). It should also be noted that paved walking and biking trails had the highest percentage of respondents select it as their first choice as the most important facility.



Need for Recreation Programs


From a list of 26 recreation <u>programs</u>, respondents were asked to indicate all of the ones that members of their household have a need for. The following summarizes key findings:

■ There are five programs that 30% or more of respondent households have a need for: adult fitness and wellness programs (45%), local history programs (35%), nature programs (34%), water fitness programs (32%), and special events (30%).



Need For Recreation <u>Programs</u> in Loudoun County, the City of Fairfax and the City of Falls Church


From the list of 26 recreation <u>programs</u>, respondents were asked to indicate all of the ones that members of their household have a need for. The graph below shows the estimated number of households in Loudoun County, the City of Fairfax and the City of Falls Church that have a need for recreation programs, based on 100,548 households in Loudoun County, the City of Fairfax and the City of Falls Church.



How Well Recreation Programs Meet Needs


From the list of 26 recreation <u>programs</u>, respondent households that have a need for programs were asked to indicate how well the programs offered by area park agencies meet their needs. The following summarizes key findings:

• For all 26 programs, less than 35% of respondents indicated that the program completely meets the needs of their household.



Loudoun County, the City of Fairfax and the City of Falls Church Households with Their <u>Program</u> Needs Being <u>50% Met or Less</u>


From the list of 26 recreation <u>programs</u>, respondent households that have a need for programs were asked to indicate how well the programs offered by area park agencies meet their needs. The graph below shows the estimated number of households in Loudoun County, the City of Fairfax and the City of Falls Church whose needs for programs are only being 50% met or less, based on 100,548 households in Loudoun County, the City of Fairfax and the City of Falls Church.



Most Important Recreation Programs

From the list of 26 recreation <u>programs</u>, respondents were asked to select the <u>four</u> that are most important to their household. The following summarizes key findings:


Based on the sum of their top 4 choices, the programs that are most important to respondent households are: adult fitness and wellness programs (27%), youth sports programs (16%), local history programs (15%), and nature programs (15%). It should also be noted that adult fitness and wellness programs had the highest percentage of respondents select it as their <u>first choice</u> as the most important program.



Reasons for Not Using Parks & Recreation Facilities & Programs More Often

From a list of 15 options, respondents were asked to select all the reasons that keep members of their household from using parks and recreation facilities and programs more often. The following summarizes key findings:


■ The most frequently mentioned reasons that keep respondent households from using parks and recreation facilities and programs more often include: "we are too busy or not interested" (36%), "facilities are not close to our residence" (21%) and "I do not know what is being offered" (19%).



Organizations Used for Parks and Recreation Programs and Facilities

From a list of 11 options, respondents were asked to select all the organizations that members of their household use for parks and recreation programs and facilities. The following summarizes key findings:


The organizations used by the highest percentage of respondent households include: Local cities/Loudoun County Parks and Recreation Department (59%), National Parks (49%) and Northern Virginia Regional Park Authority (44%).



Organizations <u>Used the Most</u> for Parks and Recreation Programs and Facilities

From the list of 11 options, respondents were asked to select the two organizations that members of their household <u>use the most</u> for parks and recreation programs and facilities. The following summarizes key findings:


Based on the sum of their top two choices, the organizations that respondent households use the most for parks and recreation programs and facilities are: Local cities/Loudoun County Parks and Recreation Department (42%), Northern Virginia Regional Park Authority (22%), private clubs (19%) and National Parks (17%).



Level of Satisfaction with Value Received from Parks & Recreation Facilities

Respondents were asked to rate their level of satisfaction with the overall value their household receives from parks and recreation facilities. The following summarizes key findings:


Sixty-seven percent (67%) of respondents indicated being either very satisfied (30%) or somewhat satisfied (37%) with the overall value their household receives from parks and recreation facilities. In addition, 8% of respondents indicated being either very dissatisfied (2%) or somewhat dissatisfied (6%) with the value received from parks and recreation facilities. An additional 14% of respondents indicated "neutral", and 11% indicated "don't know".



Actions to Improve Parks and Recreation Services in the Area

Respondents were asked to rate their level of support for various actions the Northern Virginia Regional Park Authority or the City/County of their residence could take to improve the parks and recreation services in their area. The following summarizes key findings:


■ There are three actions that over 50% of respondents are very supportive of: purchase land to preserve open space (59%), upgrade older park/recreation buildings and facilities (53%), and develop new walking/biking trails and connect existing trails (53%).



Actions Most Willing to Fund with Tax Dollars

From a list of 17 actions the Northern Virginia Regional Park Authority or the City/County of their residence could take to improve the parks and recreation services in their area, respondents were asked to select the four actions they would be <u>most willing to fund</u> with their tax dollars. The following summarizes key findings:


Based on the sum of their top four choices, the actions that respondents are most willing to fund with their tax dollars are: purchase land to preserve open space (43%), develop new walking/biking trails and connect existing trails (37%) and upgrade older park/recreation buildings and facilities (33%). It should also be noted that "purchase land to preserve open space" had the highest percentage of respondents select it as their <u>first choice</u> as the action they would be most willing to fund with their tax dollars.



Allocation of \$100 Among Parks and Recreation Facilities

Respondents were asked how they would allocate \$100 among various parks and recreation facilities in the City/County of their residence. The following summarizes key findings:

• Respondents would allocate \$34 out of every \$100 to the improvement/maintenance of existing parks. The remaining \$66 was allocated as follows: acquisition of new parkland and open space (\$30), development of new recreation and park facilities (\$29), and other (\$6).
